Types of Maps


All maps can be classified into two categories: General Purpose (Reference) Maps and Thematic Maps.

General Purpose (Reference) Maps	Thematic Maps
General Purpose Maps, or Reference Maps, show human-made (state/town boundaries, roads, etc) or natural features (mountains, rivers, etc.) of a given area.	Thematic Maps show specific maps about literally any topic you can think of. From plants to favorite foods, anything can be created into a thematic map with enough data.


Map 1: A physical map of New York State.

Map 2: A map created by Shannon Glazer to illustrate regional food favorites in New York State.





Map 4: A map of New York State with Longitude and Latitude labeled.



Map 5: A map of the British plan for taking New York State in 1777.




Map 6: A map of the Major canals of New York State in 1850.
